

Context of school for Sport Premium 2016-2017

The government is providing additional funding to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. The funding will be used specifically for the development of P.E. and sport.

The school has engaged the support of Kingswood Academy, Humber Sport Partnership (HSP), Youth Sports Trust and the Humber School Games. The school is actively working in collaboration as part of St Cuthbert's Multi-Academy Trust in Hull. The relationships between the school and the various organisations will lead to a concerted effort to ensure that all pupils in local primary schools receive similar opportunities within PE and that there is a consistent, mutually beneficial drive to raise the standards in the teaching of PE in the schools.

St. Mary Queen of Martyrs has been granted over £27,000 over the last 4 years and funding has been used to improve P.E. and sport in the school in the areas stated below.

Objectives of Sport Premium Spending

The objectives of the Sport Premium for St Mary Queen of Martyrs are:

- Professional Development of Staff to ensure quality learning and enabling confidence in planning, teaching and assessing all areas of P.E. This will be supported by additional staff training opportunities as they arise such as Matalan TOP Sports, Change 4 Life, Youth Sports Trust training.
- Resources to allow our pupils who have a wide range of specific needs to access the PE curriculum at their own level. The funding will allow the replacement of aged or damaged equipment AND the introduction of new sports to the school's curriculum and extra-curricular clubs.
- Extra-Curricular Activities to allow school representatives to compete in Level 2 competitions and higher. Funding will also be made available to support individuals (working at a high level of performance), to enable access to external opportunities such as county trials when a cost is involved.
- Develop 'club links' (local rugby, netball, football, badminton, gymnastics clubs etc.) so that children can be offered an accessible pathway in order to develop outside of the lessons.

Outcomes of Sport Premium Spending

The outcomes of the Sport Premium will be to:

- Ensure pupils become physically literate thus enabling them to access a lifelong participation in physical activity.
- Improve teacher/pupil monitoring & assessment as well as 'continuous professional development' opportunities for the staff to enhance knowledge and confidence in teaching P.E.
- Promote social skills, independent learning and positive behaviour in order to increase pupil progress and raise attainment (as per the Department for Education guidelines)
- Increase the quality of our teaching across a broad and exciting PE curriculum through which

ALL pupils will have wide-ranging opportunities to embrace and enjoy physical activity.

- Make sure that the school, children, parents and the P.E. specialists work together continuously in order to maximise the potential of every participant to be the best that they can be.

The P.E. Co-ordinator and School Business Manager will endeavour to keep up-to-date public records to demonstrate the current allocation of the PE premium funding.

Impact of Sport Premium Spending

The impact of the Sport Premium Spending this year is detailed below

Attendance figures (based upon children attending at least one extra-curricular club during the academic year)

- KS1 - 60% participated in an extra-curricular sporting club.
- KS2 - 49% participated in an extra-curricular sporting club.

Pupil Premium children who have attended at least on extra-curricular club during the academic year.

- 39% of pupil premium students in KS1 have attended a physical activity club after school.
- 44% of pupil premium students in KS2 have attended a physical activity club after school. An increase on 14% from the previous year.

Attendance of children at extra-curricular clubs

- 50% girls 50% boys KS1
- 48% girls 52% boys KS2

Competitions

Number of competitions attended.

- 11 Humber School Games
- 11 via Kingswood Sports Partnership
- 1 Diocese of Middlesbrough

- **Total number of competitions participated at level 2 - 22**
- **Total number of competitions participated at level 3 - 1**
- **Grand total of competitions participated in - 23**

117 KS2 pupils participated in level 2 competitions or above

- **63% of KS2 pupils participated in level 2 competitions.**
- **KS2 Pupil Premium competition participation – 56%. An increase of 29%**
- **59% of KS2 boys participated in level 2 competitions.**
- **68% girls participated in level 2 competitions. An increase of 27%**
- **Ratio of girls to boys participating in level 2 competitions as a percentage – Girls 54% Boys 46%**

Less active

- **10% Phase 2 pupils were identified as needing support with becoming active and positive towards physical activity. A designated member of staff was put into place to help encourage and develop healthier, active lifestyles and well-being. 55% of the children who received support then participated in at least one extra-curricular competition.**
