

Foundation Stage Spring 2

Maths:

FS1- Counting to 10 and beyond, ordering numbers, identify the properties of 2d & 3d shapes.

FS2- **measuring objects by size**, using addition and subtraction calculations to support our problem solving and finding the properties of 2d and 3d shapes.

Literacy:

FS1- Re-telling known stories and creating own stories in similar ways. Writing our names and learning new letter sounds.

FS2- Sequencing known stories then begin to write own version. Continue to write full sentences, our full name and develop our phonic skills in our writing.

Reading:

FS1- Text 'Commotion in the ocean' by Giles Andreae. Recognise and write their name and common words in the environment.

FS2- Text 'The Rainbow Fish' by Marcus Pfister & My Octopus Arms by Keith Baker. Reading green and red words, applying their phonic knowledge in their writing. Continue to read their home/school reading book.

Knowledge & Understanding:

We will be completing an experiment around floating & sinking. We will be looking at the life cycle of the turtle.

We will be looking at similarities and differences and changes in our environment and the world around us.

Technology:

We will be using the iPads to research things relating to our topic.

Expressive art & design:

Creating our own pictures by using wax and paint and marbling. Paint our own under the sea pictures using brushes and fingers. Making 'special cards.' We will be making instruments which represent different sea creatures.
